About the consultation

To prepare for the future and position it for a renewal in 2012, the Canadian Partnership Against Cancer (the Partnership) is engaging stakeholders to refresh Canada's cancer control strategy. In 2010, the Partnership began a dialogue with its partners to scope future cancer control priorities where an organization with a pan-Canadian mandate is best positioned to add value – building on successes to-date with a view to address existing and emerging opportunities for action.

The Future of Cancer Control in Canada discussion paper articulates our successes to-date as well as the case for a continued pan-Canadian cancer control strategy. It presents a working strategic framework that outlines what the Partnership believes are the core functions of a pan-Canadian cancer control organization to catalyze and add value to federal, provincial, and territorial efforts across the cancer control continuum to reduce the impact of cancer for all Canadians. It also presents key strategic themes, high-level outcomes and potential opportunities.

4. Please suggest any new partners that the Partnership should consider engaging to increase the effectiveness and impact of pan-Canadian cancer control efforts.
